10 General Business

- **Conference 2018 update**

Peter summarized conference details to date. Only 5 members have registered so far. Others having indicated they will be coming.

Peter has heard that some members feel the accommodation costs are too high. Peter put this to the conference committee with the idea of subsidizing the cost. Two did not agree and I assume the rest of the committee agree with this. Myra indicated that the overall cost was too high and felt many south island growers would not attend because of this and the travel cost. Russell suggested that an extra night accommodation might be required for those traveling after the conference as there would not be enough time for flight connections. Peter indicated that the conference would end around 2pm and with about a 2 hour travel time to Wellington airport there should be enough time. Peter suggested that the conference committee should look into this with the options of arranging transport to and from Wellington if required. Myra suggested it would have been better if the conference were held in main centres as accommodation and travel costs would be cheaper. However it was felt that places outside of the main centres would add to the attraction of coming. Myra also suggested that perhaps conferences every two years were too much. Peter indicated that that would have to be a discussion presented via remit at the next AGM. Mike suggested that we should be looking at the overall cost and suggested that a discount on the registration fee would be a fairer to all members. Pauline agreed with this as they will be using their campervan for accommodation. Mike put the following motion: That the conference committee reduce the registration fee to \$150 per person and the executive would offset the cost per registration fee estimated to be \$1,200. Sec Pauline. All agreed – Carried.

General discussion followed with goings on in the regions.

- Susi had two Michelin chefs visit who were doing a program ***Paul & Nick's Big Food Adventure***. The two chefs follow the Ulster Scots migration around the world, featuring famous characters who have made an impact on their adopted country.
- Pauline heard that Back-Yard lavender had an article in rural life magazine
- Russell has been approved from a US university to host a 5 month intern.
